

IPS, STS, CPS : What's the Difference?

1 Invited Paper Sessions (IPS)

- i. Established by the Scientific Programme Committee (SPC) of the ISI and its Associations.
- ii. Consist of 3-4 presenters and a discussant invited by organiser of the session.
- iii. The proposals will be reviewed by the SPC.
- iv. Organiser is only allowed to be either Chair, Speaker or Discussant.

2 Special Topic Sessions (STS)

- i. Submitted by individual members of the ISI and its Associations and Committees or outside institutions and organisations.
- ii. Minimum of 3 presenters and possibly a discussant invited by organiser of the Session.
- iii. The proposals will be reviewed by the Local Programme Committee (LPC).
- iv. IPS Proposals not selected by the SPC may be considered as STS.
- v. Organiser is only allowed to be either Chair, Speaker or Discussant.

3 Contributed Paper Sessions (CPS)

- i. Short paper submitted by individual and reviewed by the Local Programme Committee (LPC).
- ii. Short paper should be not more than 4 pages.
- iii. Once accepted, a contributed paper will be listed in the programme and presented in one of two modes, i.e oral or poster presentation.
